Parent Drop-in Sessions – next week (W/B 26th September)

On Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday next week, there is the opportunity for your child to offer you a tour of their classroom, show you their books and work and for you to meet with their classteacher very briefly. These are not formal parent evening sessions, therefore although teachers will be available to meet, they may also be completing marking, planning or display activities. The purpose of the visit is for your child to be your visit guide! Classrooms will be open from 3.30-4.30pm each day.

To avoid overcrowding, please be considerate if the classroom is very busy. (We will NOT be running an appointment system, however if classrooms become very busy the teacher may ask you to delay your visit for a short time.)
