1. Welcome, introduction and apologies: Eileen Raggatt welcomed everyone to the meeting. Apologies were received from Sharie Neale and Barbara Churms (BC). The meeting was quorate (The quorum is 3 as noted in the Terms of Reference).

3. Subject Overview:

Computing (HR)

The Head teacher noted that she presented to governors in July 2012 that her role was an interim role. The role is still ongoing and currently no one has been found to fill the role. Debbie Noonan joined the meeting.

A written report was circulated to governors and is annexed to the minutes and the following were highlighted:

Early Learning Goals – End of Reception

Tapestry has aided the skills of pupils and has a positive impact in sharing information, both from school to home and home to school. The use of laptops has increased in Reception this year which is as a result of a teacher who has seen the use of computing further up the school. The interactive whiteboard in Reception is not working well and has poor visual output. There is one desktop in the Reception classroom which is used by 2 children at time. Other technology is available such as cameras and children are learning to post messages in each other's trays as the beginnings of messaging.

National Curriculum Expectations

The curriculum is now based on Computing rather than ICT and there is an increased emphasis on programming which is a challenge to members of staff. For information the National Curriculum for Key Stage 1 (KS1) and Key Stage 2 (KS2) was circulated and governors took time to read it.

The Head teacher is being supported by Rebecca Burgess with the computing curriculum.

The school is using a scheme from Computing at School which provides "Switchedon Computing" giving progression pathways from KS1 onwards and the outlines were circulated to governors. A computing overview has been produced to be used by teachers across the school, this was also circulated. Governors enquired if the curriculum is in the first year of being taught. The new curriculum has only been in place for 1 year and Years 5 & 6 are having to catch up skills compared to children further down the school. All of the new resources are new to both the children and the teachers.

The storage of information held on the I-pads is still on going. Teachers are being encouraged to book time slots in the ICT suite in the next academic year to support the curriculum learning.

The Head teacher highlighted the final aim from the National Curriculum *All pupils are* responsible, competent, confident and creative users of information and communication technology. This is a real focus for the computing teaching in the school and awareness of parents. Governors enquired if information regarding internet safety and the use of social media could be put in the school newsletter or in the Home School Agreement. These areas can be considered; parents have been given the opportunity to attend information evenings delivered by the ICT service. If there are issues with pupils and problems raised regarding the use of social media and inappropriate messages being sent to other pupils then the Head teacher will speak to
