



In Science we will be.....

Learning about sound: identifying how sound travels and investigating ways to alter pitch and volume.

We will also learn about living things and their habitat, understanding how things can be grouped in a variety of ways and using classification to group and name a variety of living things in their local and wider environment.



In Art and DT we will be...

Learning about Andy Warhol and using his work as a basis for our own painting.

In DT we will be designing and making our own musical instruments linked to our Science unit on Sound.



In History and Geography we will be....



Focusing on North America, we will be comparing geographical features, both human and physical with our local area. We will learn about mountains, rivers and lakes.

We will also be improving our location knowledge, by learning to position a range of places on a map, and naming the continents.

There will be a history element, learning about the native Americans.

In Music this term we will be...

Studying 'The Firebird' by Igor Stravinsky. We will compose descriptive music to match three images from the story: the ice statues in the garden, the Firebird, the final celebration.

In MFL this term we will be...



Developing our language skills with a focus on weather and modes of transport. We will have a go at presenting our own forecast in French!

In PSHE this term we are thinking about..



Our emotions; how they can impact our behaviour and how we can control them.

Drugs; how they can be used to help people and how to keep ourselves safe.

In Computing this term we will be...

Learning to use Power Point and then produce our own presentation.

We will also be continuing to use Scratch. There will be opportunities to use computers for research and for presenting our work in our other subject areas.



In RE this term we will be...



Thinking about what Christians learn from the story of Creation and the Fall. We will then complete a unit learning about the relevance of Easter today.

In English this term we will be looking at biographies and finding out about some people to write our own biographies, including the author Anne Fine. We will read some books by Anne Fine during our guided reading lessons. We will also be learning about report writing. We will read and write riddles, newspaper reports and stories from an-

other culture, linking to our topic on North America. We will have regular spelling and grammar sessions and opportunity for writing in other areas of the curriculum.



In Maths this term we will be using column methods for multiplication, as well as learning about fractions and decimals and the links between them. We will also learn about time and money, as well as keeping on top of what we learned in the Autumn term (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division). There will be plenty of opportunity for reasoning and explaining our thinking in the different areas of work.
